3. Financial Report


- As of April 30, the BUCC account has a balance of \$2,254.11. An Additional \$25 will be deposited today.



- From Julie Maki: This appears to be a record shattering year for excavation around Idaho. Just through April, Digline has seen an increase of over 18% in the number of locates requested compared to 2020. That is just over 10,000 additional locate requests so far. And when we are that busy, so are the contractors, locators, engineers, homeowners, and utilities. It gets stressful for everyone when we are busy like this, but keeping the communication open is important for all of the stakeholders. If there is anything we can do to help make the process easier, please let me know.



The chart below shows the number of homeowner requests over the past three years. You can see how the number of homeowner calls jumped when the pandemic hit last March through June while people were at home. It has gone down some this year, but more homeowners seem to be aware of the 'Call Before You Dig' process than in previous years.



Our Database Department has entered close to 50 new subdivisions into our base map so far this year. These subdivisions are located in Ada, Canyon, Payette, Gem, Valley, Bannock, and Twin Falls Counties.
