- Positive Response
  - Requestor call into 811 or use web 811 notifies utility locator
     utility locator notifies requestor
  - Education
    - ✓ What is positive response?
    - ✓ Voluntary implementation or state mandated?
    - ✓ Training required on software used
    - ✓ Roles for 811 what roles will the call centers play?
- Idaho Statutes on what a business day is
  - The day you call in does not count. The business day starts 24 hours after the call is placed.
  - Currently, it takes 48 hours from the time you call in. If you call in on Tuesday at 10:47 a.m., you will have a locate by Thursday at 10:47 a.m.
  - Starting this summer (hopefully July 1), under Idaho law, if the call comes in Tuesday at 10:47 a.m., you will have a locate by 11:59 p.m. Thursday.
  - Emergency locates work will start within two hours or less than two business days
- DIRT data collection site for damages. This is for statistical reasons only. If you want to file a complaint, you need to go through the Damage Prevention Board.
   Jerry Peterson, who spoke at the BUCC breakfast, is putting together a presentation on DIRT. That will be passed on to us when Julie receives it.
